

DOWNTOWN SCENE

The roots of the destination originate in downtown Las Vegas, which was established as a city in 1905. Starting out as a railroad stop, the area quickly boomed into a destination for leisure and neon lights. Looking for the original, vintage Vegas? Head downtown. From the Fremont East Entertainment District to the Arts District, downtown is the original hot spot to see in Vegas.

You'll find much more than historic buildings and retro experiences. In the mood for a Broadway show set in a world-class theater? The Smith Center for the Performing Arts in Symphony Park offers a line-up of celebrated musicals through its Broadway Las Vegas Series. Searching for a space where guests can sip handcrafted cocktails or craft brews while enjoying live music? That's possible in the Fremont East Entertainment District, the 18b Arts District, or the Arts District's Brewery Row, as all have several bars to suit everyone's unique taste. Looking for one-of-a-kind artwork? Wander the galleries of the 18b Arts District or discover the unique murals and instillations throughout the streets of downtown. There's something for everyone to experience in this flourishing, walkable neighborhood.

COMING SOON

Station Casinos has unveiled plans for its new **Wildfire Casino** location at 2700 Fremont Street. Set to open in early February, the 21,000-square-foot space will offer guests gaming options (including an STN Sports sportsbook), a lively bar, food outlets IHOP and Tacos El Pastor and free parking.

WHAT'S NEW

La Mona Rosa, a new Downtown Las Vegas dining destination, is now open in the space formerly occupied by Morton Restaurant Group's La Comida. Executive Chefs Daniel Arias and Isidro Marquez-Castillo curate the new concept's menu, which celebrates Mexico's diverse regions through traditional dishes that are complemented by craft cocktails. The 3,500-square-foot space features an open kitchen and a stage for a range of live entertainment and nightlife experiences.

DOWNTOWN LAS VEGAS HOTELS

Binion's Gambling Hall

Binion's is home to the most famous poker room in the world, Binion's Hall of Fame Poker Room, and is recognized as the place that made poker famous. What started as an intimate game of poker between friends grew into the World Series of Poker, which is one of the largest and most prestigious tournaments in the world. The hotel and casino also houses the \$1 Million Dollar Display, where visitors can pose for photos with one million dollars in cash. Since its opening in 1951, Binion's has preserved the feel of Old Vegas throughout the years. The casino recently refreshed its Whiskey Up Saloon, allowing visitors to experience the Fremont Street Experience from a rotating bar with two open air balconies.

California Hotel and Casino

Although named after the Golden State, the California Hotel and Casino takes inspiration from the Aloha State. In operation for over four decades, the California offers a flare for all things Hawaii, with staffers donning Hawaiian shirts, island hospitality and the best Hawaiian shaved ice in Las Vegas.

Circa Resort & Casino

CEO and developer Derek Stevens debuted his newest Downtown Las Vegas property, **Circa Resort & Casino**, in Oct. 2020. The 1.25 million-square-foot integrated casino-resort features downtown's tallest resort tower, five floors of amenities and a state-of-the-art parking hub dubbed the Garage Mahal. Its arrival made history as the first resort to open in Downtown Las Vegas in 40 years.

The D Las Vegas

The hotel and casino embodies the fresh, energetic attitude and fun atmosphere that Downtown Las Vegas is known for. The property features a unique two-level casino that boasts the latest in slots and table games manned by the D's playful dancing dealers on the first floor, and transports guests back in time to old-school Vegas with its Vintage Casino on the second floor, which houses the last Sigma Derby machine in Las Vegas.

Downtown Grand Hotel & Casino

Downtown Grand Hotel & Casino is a unique hospitality and entertainment destination right in the heart of Downtown Las Vegas. Located on 3rd Street between Ogden and Stewart, Downtown Grand encompasses an entire urban block of hotel, casino and dining amenities. The property features an eight-story, 18-story and 25-story tower, adjoined by a walking bridge elevated over 3rd Street, with 1,124 guest rooms and suites offering luxury accommodations. The hotel offers restaurants, bars and entertainment options including Freedom Beat, Furnace Bar, Art Bar, Sidebar and the award-winning Las Vegas steakhouse Triple George Grill. Downtown Grand also features Citrus Grand Pool Deck, a rooftop pool experience with more than 35,000 square feet of entertainment and special event space, an infinity pool, restaurant and bar, semi-private cabanas, a fire pit and a grass seating area.

El Cortez Hotel and Casino

Visitors looking for a vintage experience can find all the historical charm of Old Vegas at El Cortez. The iconic hotel and casino is the longest continuously running hotel and casino in Las Vegas. Built in 1941, El Cortez is a staple to the Downtown Las Vegas scene and was placed on the National Register of Historic Places in 2013. The iconic venue has been renovated throughout the years but maintains the nod to its historical roots.

The ENGLiSH Hotel

Celebrity chef Todd English brings his signature taste to every aspect of this new hotel that recently opened in the Arts District. The ENGLiSH Hotel boasts stylish suites, a shimmering pool and The Pepper Club, a Japanese/Mediterranean fusion restaurant and the latest concept from the James Beard Award winner.

Four Queens Hotel and Casino

Built in 1966, the Four Queens Hotel and Casino has stayed true to its retro roots over the decades and still boasts a lineup of old-school Vegas entertainment. The property is also home to Hugo's Cellar, routinely named one of the best fine dining restaurants in Las Vegas.

Fremont Hotel and Casino

Fremont Hotel and Casino is conveniently located in the heart of the Fremont Street Experience. The Fremont thrives off the energy of the always-lively Fremont Street Experience, continuing throughout the 14-story hotel and casino. The only Tony Roma's restaurant in Nevada is located at Fremont Hotel and Casino.

Golden Gate Hotel and Casino

Opened in 1906, the Golden Gate paved the way for Downtown Las Vegas. In 1927, the hotel installed one of the first neon signs on Fremont Street and introduced its signature shrimp cocktail shortly after. In Sept. 2017, the iconic hotel unveiled its completed expansion project, which nearly doubled the casino size while adding a dramatic new entryway and extending its high-energy outdoor Bar, OneBar at One Fremont Street.

Golden Nugget Las Vegas

The hotel's popular pool is home to The Tank, where visitors climb 30-feet into the air to take a water slide through a jaw-dropping shark aquarium. The Golden Nugget not only has the world's largest gold nugget on display, but also boasts an ATM that sells gold bars. Golden Nugget is now home to the only Chick-Fil-A location in Downtown Las Vegas.

Main Street Station Casino, Brewery and Hotel

History buffs and antique artifact appreciators will be in heaven at Main Street Station Casino, Brewery and Hotel. The downtown jewel houses a huge slab of the Berlin Wall, restored railroad cars, a statue of a wild boar that was previously in a fountain in Nice, France, and many more relicts scattered throughout the property.

18B – THE LAS VEGAS ARTS DISTRICT

In Downtown Las Vegas' Arts District you will find an eclectic mix of galleries, one-of-a-kind stores, bars and restaurants just a short walk or bus ride from Fremont Street. Known as "18b," the Las Vegas Arts District is located south of the Fremont Street Experience in an area approximately bounded by Commerce Street to the west, Hoover Avenue to the north, Fourth Street to the east and Colorado Avenue to the south. The original name, "18b," represented the original Arts District area, which consisted of 18 blocks. Today, the Arts District area has grown beyond those original 18 blocks and is a classic urban mix of residential, commercial and cultural uses and continues to grow as the hub of the arts scene in Las Vegas.

Able Baker Brewing Company

With communal tables and benches lining the bar, this welcoming brewpub is part of Downtown Las Vegas' recently designated Brewery Row. Extremely popular among locals and tourists alike, Able Baker features a tap list with something for everyone.

Antique Alley

More than 20 independent antique and vintage stores make up what is known as Antique Alley, with the majority located in the arts district. Catering to mid-century modern design enthusiasts, lovers of vintage clothes and collectors of antiques of all kinds, popular shops include Buffalo Exchange, Main Street Mercantile and ReBAR.

Artifice

Artifice is a casual neighborhood lounge offering delicious drinks, boutique wines, an eclectic music program and three different rooms in which to lounge, which feature paintings and

photography by artists from Vegas and beyond. Signature drinks include creative concoctions such as The Warhol, Taming of the Shrew and Nicky Free.

Arts Factory

This mainstay of the Arts District features several galleries, boutique shops and more. With over 30,000 square feet of indoor space and 20,000 square feet of outdoor space, the Arts Factory is always housing a plethora of art in Downtown Las Vegas.

Art Square

Art Square, which is comprised of three remodeled buildings and an outdoor art garden, is a bustling retail and cultural center. The complex is home to the First Friday Foundation and Nevada Humanities, among art galleries and boutiques.

Brett Wesley Gallery

Located downtown in the heart of the 18b Arts District, award-winning Brett Wesley Gallery is a respected resource for collectors, designers and corporations. The gallery specializes in contemporary paintings, photography and sculpture by both established and emerging artists.

Clay Arts Vegas

Clay Arts Vegas was started in 2011 as a collaboration amongst artists living and working in the Las Vegas area to celebrate clay and other three-dimensional art. Their studio, gallery, shop, and educational space are all located in the Arts District. Clay Arts Vegas sells Laguna Clay Co. products in its store and features a 600-square-foot gallery offering a monthly rotation of shows.

Cornish Pasty Co.

This restaurant offers a selection of Cornish pasties, savory pastries that originated in Cornwall in southwest England. The menu also features soups, salads, and desserts—all with vegan options available.

CraftHaus Arts District

The popular Henderson brewery expanded to Downtown Las Vegas with a taproom right on Brewery Row. The 24 beers on tap are complemented by food options such as European sausages and cheese and charcuterie boards.

Esther's Kitchen

Located in the heart of the Arts District, Esther's Kitchen serves up seasonal Italian soul food. Guests can enjoy a menu of clean, modern fare made with the freshest ingredients. Esther's also offers nightly specials featuring delicious dishes, taking an unadulterated twist on traditional Italian cuisine.

First Friday

On the first Friday of each month, an arts and cultural event is held in the Arts District. The "First Friday" festival draws up to 20,000 visitors into the vibrant neighborhood. This event encourages people to flock downtown to browse, buy, eat, drink and mingle. The event is a festive environment with food and beverage vendors, music, visual performances and artists displaying their works, as well as family and child-friendly activities.

Garagiste

This neighborhood space and storefront strives to cultivate an environment that encourages exploration and discovery through the sharing of knowledge and wine. The store focuses on small-production wines from regions off the beaten path.

Good Pie

Good Pie is a Brooklyn-style pizza shop, which honors the New York tradition of serving up quality slices made from the best ingredients including flour and tomatoes imported from Italy and locally sourced produce. Guests can enjoy Brooklyn-style round slices and pies, Detroit-style Sicilian squares and award-winning gluten-free and vegan pizzas.

Hop Nuts Brewing

Serving premium craft beer, Hop Nuts was the first microbrewery to open in the Arts District. The beer haven provides guests with a unique craft beer experience in a relaxed atmosphere.

HUDL Brewing Company

With brewery operations just steps away from HUDL's bar and lounge area, visitors might just have the chance to watch the brewing company make their suds while sipping them. With industrial touches and a tap list including some recent award-winning beers, this has become a hot spot in Downtown's Brewery Row.

Jammyland Cocktail Bar & Reggae Kitchen

Located in a former service garage, Jammyland pays tribute to Jamaican rum, food and music. Guests can take in the reggae vibe while enjoying delicious dishes, handcrafted cocktails and entertainment either inside the venue or on one of the bar's oversized patios.

Makers & Finders

This coffee bar places an emphasis on Free Trade coffee and urban craft. In addition to coffee, they serve Latin comfort food.

Millennium Fandom Bar

Located in the Soho Lofts building, this pop culture-inspired bar invites visitors to enjoy themed craft cocktails while bonding over favorite fandoms, including comics, movies, video games and cosplay—and costumes are generally encouraged. The space also features weekly events such as fandom karaoke, trivia, movie nights and weekend cosplay parties.

Neon Desert Brewing

This brewery and taphouse features over 20 taps, rotating its own craft creations with guest brewery beers. The space also regularly hosts food trucks and live performances from local musicians.

Nevada Brew Works

This brewery specializes in boilermakers, as the 10 beers on tap can be paired with a selection from its extensive whiskey list. Nevada Brew Works also offers various delicious appetizers, brick-oven pizzas and more.

The Silver Stamp

This beer bar features 20 taps, with selections including local, regional and national beers—including brews made distinctively for the bar. The retro-inspired space also offers an additional 50 beers in the can and bottle, as well as bar snacks and special events with live music and DJs.

Velveteen Rabbit

This shabby-chic hangout is well-known for its craft cocktails and beer selection. Velveteen Rabbit creates seasonal libations using only homemade ingredients and fresh produce. The

eclectic space focuses on local music, local art and performance, boutique spirits and vintage touches.

Vesta Coffee Roasters

Vesta offers discerning coffee drinkers quality roasts and traceable bean origins, in addition to a food menu of toasts, sandwiches, salads and more.

FREMONT STREET ENTERTAINMENT DISTRICT

Located in the heart of downtown, the Fremont East Entertainment District (FEED) sits adjacent to the popular Fremont Street Experience. Fremont East features music clubs, lounges, bars, restaurants, boutiques and other arts and entertainment venues. FEED is centered on Fremont Street, spanning Las Vegas Boulevard to Eighth Street.

Carson Kitchen

This American gastro lounge, from the late celebrity chef Kerry Simon, encourages sharing of plates, entrees, flatbreads and other menu items. The rooftop patio offers spectacular views and live entertainment.

Commonwealth

Commonwealth brings a stylish social scene to burgeoning Downtown Vegas. The swanky, 6,000-square-foot cocktail bar is a collision of art and architectural influences inspired by pre-Prohibition era design and libations, complete with its very own backroom speakeasy, "The Laundry Room." The venue's rooftop bar gives patrons 360-degree views of Fremont Street in a classic East Coast pub atmosphere. The main room is outfitted with exposed brick, dark woods and eclectic furniture.

Corduroy

An unpretentious neighborhood bar, Corduroy recently opened in the Fremont East Entertainment District. Boasting retro '70s-inspired décor, downtown's newest watering hole serves up refreshing signature cocktails and a selection of craft beers.

Donut Bar

The world-famous bakery recently opened in the Fremont East Entertainment District. Donut Bar has won many awards and accolades for their over-sized donuts in unique flavors, including "Homer's Donut," maple Bourbon, mud pie, cake batter and more.

Downtown Cocktail Room

An intimate cocktail room and speakeasy in the heart of Las Vegas, Downtown Cocktail Room is 3,000-square-feet of warm bohemian-chic décor. D.C.R. is among Las Vegas' most prominent and respected cocktail bars, offering seasonal menus and amazing hand-crafted cocktails. The cocktail lounge features Mike Morey's Sip 'n' Tip, an intimate backroom for patrons to imbibe refreshing concoctions and specialty craft beers.

Downtown Container Park

Downtown Container Park has become a central hub for all things dining, shopping and entertainment in the Fremont East area of Downtown Las Vegas. Opening its doors to the first guests in 2013, the unique structure serves as an incubator for small businesses. The architecture of the Park stands out among the mid-century buildings of downtown as it is assembled from recycled shipping containers and locally manufactured Xtreme Cubes. The

venue's centerpiece is The Treehouse, complete with a 33-foot slide that provides fun for guests of all ages.

Eureka!

Recently opened inside the former Emergency Arts building, Eureka! serves up classic American dishes, craft beer and small-batch spirits in an industrial and modern atmosphere.

Evel Pie

Inspired by famed daredevil Evel Knievel, this pizza place serves up New York-style pizza by the slice and baked-to-order pies. Guests can enjoy a slice while sipping on a selection of craft and classic American backyard beers. Infusing its motto of "Live hard, ride fast, eat pizza," Evel Pie's eclectic design features pinball machines, Evel memorabilia, retro beach cruiser bicycles, downtown skateboards, a bronze statue of its namesake and much more.

Flippin' Good Burgers and Shakes

Flippin' Good, offers a fresh take on burgers, chicken, salads, shakes and concretes. Although known for juicy burgers, the meal is not complete without a milkshake, float or concrete or ice cold local brew.

The Griffin

With its dark, fireplace-lit, stone-faced interior, The Griffin offers patrons refreshing libations, accommodating bartenders, a quality beer list and a laid-back atmosphere. Downtowners looking to dance are invited to check out the back room where DJs are spinning for energetic crowds.

Inspire Bar, Lounge & Nightclub

Inspire Theater is a multi-function venue located in the heart of Downtown Las Vegas. Featuring cocktail bars, patios and roof-top lounge, this watering hole inspires all to meet, gather, relax and enjoy.

Le Thai

Le Thai is a popular beer garden and Thai restaurant located in the Fremont East area of Downtown Las Vegas. Soon after opening its doors, word got around that this unassuming restaurant offers some of the best Thai in all of Las Vegas. Lines routinely stretch out the door and down the street.

Oddfellows

A home for those who don't enjoy dance clubs, Oddfellows is a video club. Each night features a different theme, from '80s to classic soul and everything in between, led by video DJs. Patrons enjoy a laid-back atmosphere in the bar with an array of songs and genres.

Park on Fremont

Park on Fremont spruces up Downtown Las Vegas with its 5,000-square-foot gastropub offering innovative bar fare, an eclectic art collection, a laid-back area for dining indoors and a lush garden for dining outdoors. Half of the venue is a patio designed to resemble a mature backyard garden, complete with antique tables, a mosaic-tile hopscotch game, a flower-filled and claw-footed bathtub, an outdoor bar built to resemble an aging greenhouse, and wood salvaged from an old barn. The drink menu features 14 beers on tap and more than two dozen canned beers from around the world, in addition to Park's distinctive gin and vodka selections of specialty Bloody Marys served in mason jars.

Smashed Pig

An English-inspired gastropub, Smashed Pig serves upscale bar food in the Fremont East area, focused on high-quality food and craft beer. The savory dishes featured on the seasonal menu delight visitors seeking a global flare to their fare.

Therapy

Therapy serves progressive and delicious American bites in a modern setting. Menu items are perfectly complemented by handcrafted cocktails, draft beers and house-made sangrias.

AROUND THE FREMONT AREA

11th Street Records

A hub for music fans, vinyl collectors, musicians and their audiences, 11th Street Records buys, sells, trades and records at the in-store studio. 11th Street Records hosts vinyl listening parties, in-store performances, live streaming of performances and anything that revolves around vinyl records. Attracting big name talent, award-winning alternative rock band The Killers recorded their 2017 album, *Wonderful Wonderful*, at 11th Street Records.

Atomic Liquors

Located at 917 Fremont Street, Atomic Liquors is the oldest freestanding bar in Las Vegas. A staple in Downtown Las Vegas' rich history, the iconic venue is known for unique handcrafted cocktails, expansive beer offerings and 1950s-style atmosphere. The iconic downtown bar recently expanded with the opening of The Kitchen at Atomic, which offers delicious bar bites and a seasonally changing menu.

EAT

Chef Natalie Young's EAT, a breakfast and lunch hot spot serves up comfort foods for early risers. EAT offers the freshest, most sustainable ingredients while sourcing from local farmers markets.

Gold Spike / Oasis at Gold Spike

The former Gold Spike hotel and casino was reinvented as an interactive bar (Gold Spike) and boutique hotel (Oasis at Gold Spike). Gold Spike is a one-of-a-kind bar and nightlife venue featuring an oversized playground for adults, including supersized versions of classic games as well as lively events, activities and music. Located a few steps away is Oasis, which boasts 44 remodeled rooms that provide a unique experience for the urban adventurer.

SYMPHONY PARK AREA

Cleveland Clinic Lou Ruvo Center for Brain Health

Not only is Las Vegas home to one of the best brain health clinics in the country, but that clinic is also designed by Frank Ghery. Cleveland Clinic first began offering services in Las Vegas at Cleveland Clinic Lou Ruvo Center for Brain Health in 2009. The Center currently treats patients for a variety of neurological disorders, including Alzheimer's, Huntington's and Parkinson's diseases, multiple sclerosis, and memory disorders of all kinds. The Center is also known for the many supportive services it provides for the family members of those who suffer from these disorders.

Discovery Children's Museum

Opening the doors to a brand-new facility in 2013, the Discovery Children's Museum, located adjacent to The Smith Center for the Performing Arts, is a cultural staple in the new Symphony

Park area of Downtown Las Vegas. The 58,000-square-foot building is home to nine-themed exhibition halls totaling 26,000-square-feet of interactive, hands-on core exhibits. The 5,000-square-foot Featured Exhibitions Gallery is large enough to accommodate major exhibits from the nation's leading museums. The new location is a safe, easily accessible, family-oriented and energetic educational destination that offers visitors extraordinary learning experiences and enhanced school, public and extended programs.

The Smith Center for the Performing Arts

From its very beginning, The Smith Center was envisioned as a world-class performing arts center that would develop and present the best and brightest in a broad range of first-rate programming to unite the residents of the Las Vegas community. This cultural complex enables Southern Nevada to take its place on an international stage, celebrating artistic excellence, education and culture from around the world.

World Market Center

The Las Vegas Market was one of the first tenants to occupy the Symphony Park area of Downtown Las Vegas. The Las Vegas Market has earned a reputation as the industry's preeminent market for finding new products, trends and design. Virtually all Las Vegas Market exhibiting companies – ranging from the world's leading manufacturers to some of the most innovative companies – continue to introduce new products at each market.

Las Vegas Premium Outlets

With more than 150 stores, the Las Vegas Premium Outlets' North location has grown into one of the most popular shopping destinations in Las Vegas, drawing thousands of visitors to the Symphony Park area of Downtown Las Vegas every year.

OTHER DOWNTOWN EXPERIENCES

Life Is Beautiful Music & Art Festival

The Life Is Beautiful Music & Art Festival brings amazing music, world-class food, iconic public speakers and phenomenal art together for an incredible three-day event. Founded in 2013, the festival welcomes thousands of visitors to Downtown Las Vegas as well as marquee musicians, celebrity chefs, artists and speakers.

Downtown Art Murals

With the help of the Life is Beautiful Music Festival's art program, Downtown Las Vegas has become one of the largest, free public art galleries in the world. More than 30 vibrant murals by internationally known artists such as D*Face, Shepard Fairey, and Okuda San Miguel decorate the streets of the burgeoning neighborhood.

Fremont Street Experience

Located in Downtown Las Vegas, the Fremont Street Experience offers free nightly shows featuring 12.5 million lights and 550,000 watts of amazing sound in VivaVision, as well as free concerts and special events throughout the year.

Neonopolis

Located at the eastern edge of the Fremont Street Experience, Neonopolis is a multi-level complex offering 300,000-square-feet of retail, dining and entertainment. Highlights include Banger Brewing, a craft brewery, hobby shops and much more.

SlotZilla

The newest attraction at the Fremont Street Experience, SlotZilla takes guests soaring on a zipline 12-stories above the crowds for a once-in-a-lifetime experience under the lights of Viva Vision. The multi-million-dollar SlotZilla is the world's largest slot machine, featuring Las Vegas icons such as over-sized dice, a martini glass, pink flamingo, coins, video reels, giant arm and two showgirls.

Triple George Grill

Known as one of the first independent eateries to emerge during the revitalization of Downtown Las Vegas, Triple George Grill blends classic dining with the charm of a neighborhood restaurant. Guests enjoy a fresh selection of American-style seafood, steaks and chops as well as homemade soups, salads, pasta dishes and daily specials.

Fergusons Downtown

Fergusons Downtown is a city block rooted in community, celebrating local music, art and creators. Through the revitalization of the historic Fergusons Motel, Fergusons Downtown is cultivating a diverse and inviting community that fosters creativity and passion. From the shops of local makers to restaurants and an enchanting green space, Fergusons is a place where the community can connect, shop, eat, drink, stay, work and explore.

Peyote

Peyote is a concept from Corner Bar Management, the firm behind downtown Las Vegas hot spots Park on Fremont and Commonwealth. Housed in Fergusons Downtown, Peyote serves from-scratch seasonal new American cuisine and craft cocktails for brunch and dinner. The bistro features an industrial design with neon and fresh flower accents, as well as an expansive desert patio complete with a communal fire pit.

The Mob Museum: National Museum of Organized Crime & Law Enforcement

The Mob Museum provides a world-class, interactive journey through true stories of some of history's most notorious criminals. From the birth of the Mob to today's headlines, the museum details the history of organized crime in America. This eye-opening, authentic view of organized crime's impact on the world reveals an insider's look at the events and characters of the continuing battle between the Mob and the law. The Mob Museum is also home to The Underground, an immersive Prohibition history exhibition that occupies the entire basement level of the Museum and includes a working distillery and speakeasy.

Mothership Coffee

Mothership, housed in Fergusons Downtown, uses ethically sourced coffee, offers house made pastries has a warm and welcoming atmosphere. Favorites include the Matcha Rose Croissant and Vegan Cinnamon Roll as well as new items like charcuterie boards, sandwiches and their signature cattail cocktail program made from beer and wine. Mothership also offers a grab-and-go coffee and pastry option, happy hour and a comfy spot to co-work and connect with the community.

Neon Museum

Looking at the glitz and glam of vintage Vegas, the Neon Museum is home to the neon lights of Vegas past, including the original signs for iconic hotels including Stardust, Moulin Rouge, Binion's and many more. The museum is dedicated to collecting, preserving, studying and exhibiting iconic Las Vegas signs for educational, historic, arts and cultural enrichment. The campus includes the outdoor exhibition space known as the Neon Boneyard, a visitors' center housed inside the former La Concha Motel lobby and the Neon Boneyard North Gallery which houses additional rescued signs.
